Dear Friends,

2009 has been a transitional year for Brent's Place and the Brent Eley Foundation (BEF). One year ago, Adele and our staff were jammed into a one bedroom apartment trying to close 2008 while we waited for the new Brent's Place to be completed. Today we occupy the new facility located just one block west of the Anschutz Medical Campus. Previously Brent's Place consisted of 11 apartments in two buildings with our staff and family gathering spaces located in a third, separate building. Today we have a beautiful state-of-the-art new building with 16 apartments, amenity spaces for the families, and administrative space for our staff all under one roof! Additionally, we continue to operate Brent's Place at 1721 Marion Street, thanks to a grant from the Colorado Health Foundation. This gives us two locations and 20 apartments for long-term family stays while a family member recovers enough from aggressive cancer treatments to go home. Our program is specifically designed for recovering children with cancer but we also serve adult oncology patients and their families. Our new Brent's Place in Aurora has been a huge transition to a "new normal" just as our economy is finding a "new normal."

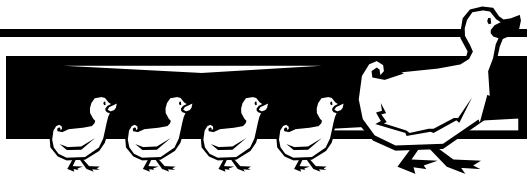
The changes in our economy over the past 12 months have impacted everybody but especially charities like BEF who rely upon public support. We have experienced lower levels of corporate sponsorship in 2009; our response has been to transition to strategic partners and grass roots support. We are very encouraged because our 2009 fund raising events were very well attended and our strategic partners recognize the value of our Mission to their patients. Our challenge is to continue to add value to the community, and, if we do that, I believe the community will support us. Adding value is always a challenge, but it is not nearly as difficult as what our families face every day. Our mission is "creating communities of hope and healing... for our kids with cancer." We do this by making their lives better every day through safe, clean and comfortable housing and by surrounding them with caring people.

Our Mission continues to attract great people and they make Brent's Place possible! This year **Adele** celebrated her 10th year as our Executive Director. She has been instrumental in the growth of our programs and the quality of our services. **Katie Keating, Laurie Marshall, Pam Thomas** and **Stan** and **Linda Nicolls** make up our full-time staff and they do the hard work of laughing and crying with our families, maintaining our facilities and fund raising. We expanded our Board of Directors this year from 9 to 15 and they are experienced community leaders who care and donate their time and talent to our Mission. It is a privilege to work with and be around such a great group of people. I also thank our volunteers and donors for believing in our Mission and choosing Brent's Place for their community service and financial support.

It has been a transitional year with dramatic changes and growth for Brent's Place. We look forward to being part of the Anschutz Medical Campus and serving the Community for a very long time. You can help us with a year end donation and continued support of our Events and programs in 2010.

Jayme stayed at Brent's Place for 121 days. Her older and younger sisters and parents stayed with her, encouraged her and supported her during the treatment and healing process. We were delighted to see Jayme go home in time for her birthday.

When we found out our daughter, Jayme would need a Bone Marrow Transplant our first question was HOW?? How are we going to make this work? We live more than 6 hours from Denver Children's Hospital! How can we afford to live in Denver while we still have a home in Wyoming? How can we keep our family together? Having four girls, ranging in ages from 3-11, this was a huge concern of ours. Brent's Place was the answer to our prayers and an answer to the HOW? Once we toured Brent's Place and met the caring staff there, we instantly knew that it could work and that we COULD DO IT!

Living in a "home" with other families that all share the same concerns and desires means so much. We are all there to get and keep our loved ones healthy! At Brent's Place we were able to still be a family while dealing with all the medical issues. We were there over 100 days and I have to say that I believe staying at Brent's Place and being a family is a huge part of what helped our daughter heal so quickly! 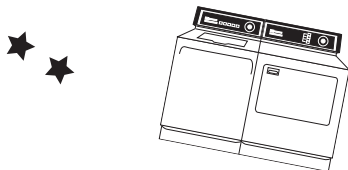
